How to Knit a Baby Bird Nest

Notes before you get started:

- •This pattern requires small amounts of washable worsted weight yarn. Acrylic is great because it can stand up to multiple washings. This is a great project for left-over yarn!
- •Any color is fine, as long as it is not very bright. Also try not to use fuzzy yarn, as the birds' toes might get caught in it.



- •This pattern is knit double stranded. If you want to use two different colors, that's fine. You can also see what you are doing much easier.
- •For this project you will knit round, on round knitting needles.

Instructions

There are 3 different sizes you can make, a small, medium, and large.

For small cast on 32, for medium cast on 44 and for large cast on 56

For each size keep knitting until you have 5 inches for a large nest, 4.5 inches for a medium nest and 4.5 inches for a small nest. Once you have finished the necessary height, purl one row. The purled row adds stability to the nest, helping it rest square.

Decreasing:

Row 1; knit 6 for small (9 for medium, 12 for large) knit two together, then repeat until the end of the row

Row 2: knit 5 (8, 11) knit two together, then repeat until the end of the row

Row 3: knit 4 (7, 10) knit two together, then repeat until the end of the row

Row 4: knit 3 (6, 9) knit two together, then repeat until the end of the row

Keep doing this (next row 2, then next row 1) until you have a total of 8 stitches together. Cut the yarn so you have a few inches left. Keep knitting, but pull the yarn through the stitch. Do this to all of the stitches. Once you have completed this, tie it off.
